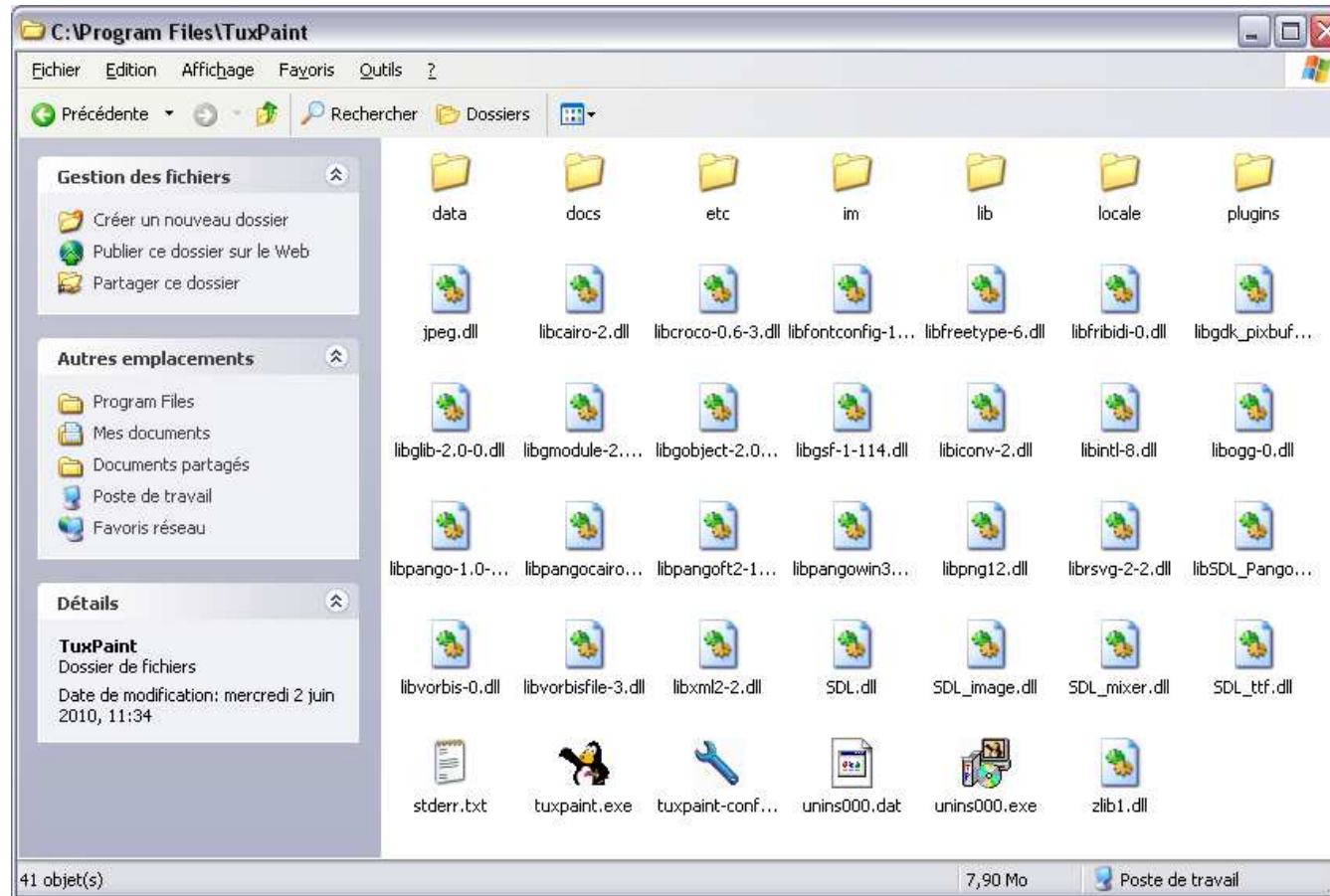


Configurer Tux Paint

Onglet Image/Son

Cursor:

- Fancy Cursor Shapes
Change the shape of the mouse pointer depending on where the mouse is and what you are doing.
- Hide Cursor
Completely hides cursor (useful on touchscreen devices).

Keyboard:

- Enable Keyboard Shortcuts
Allows key combinations to be used as shortcuts for certain commands. (e.g., Control+S to Save)

Mouse:

- Grab Mouse Pointer
Prevents the mouse pointer from leaving the Tux Paint window.
- Mouse Wheel Support
Allows a mouse wheel to be used to scroll through items. (e.g., brushes, stamps)
- No Button Distinction
Allows middle and right mouse buttons to be used for clicking, too.

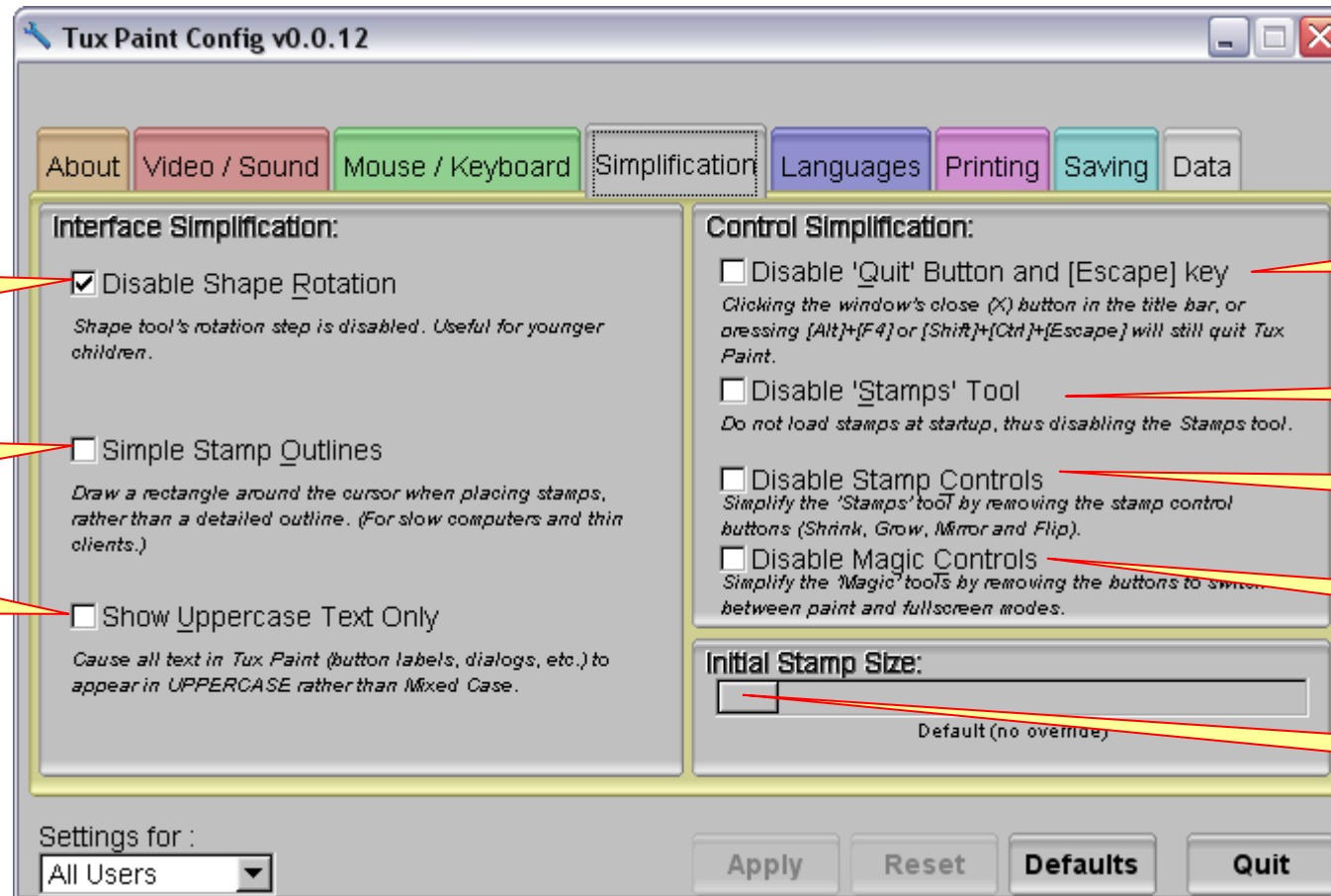

Callouts:

- Modifie le curseur selon l'outil choisi (points to 'Fancy Cursor Shapes')
- Pas de curseur (points to 'Hide Cursor')
- Autoriser les raccourcis-clavier (ex : Ctrl+S pour Sauvegarder) (points to 'Enable Keyboard Shortcuts')
- Empêcher le pointeur de quitter la fenêtre de travail (points to 'Grab Mouse Pointer')
- Utiliser la roulette (points to 'Mouse Wheel Support')
- Affecter la fonction clic-gauche à tous les boutons (points to 'No Button Distinction')

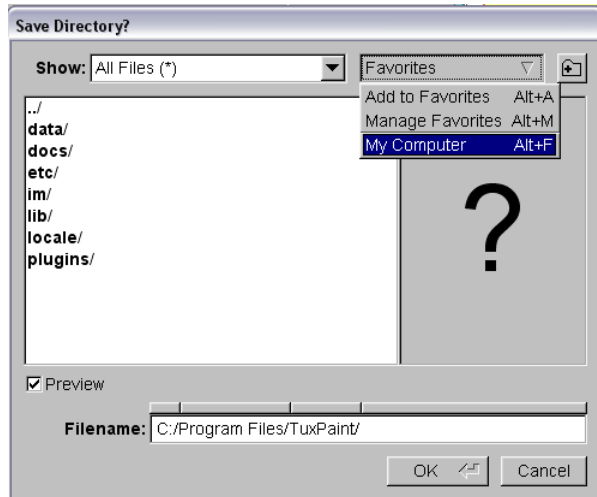

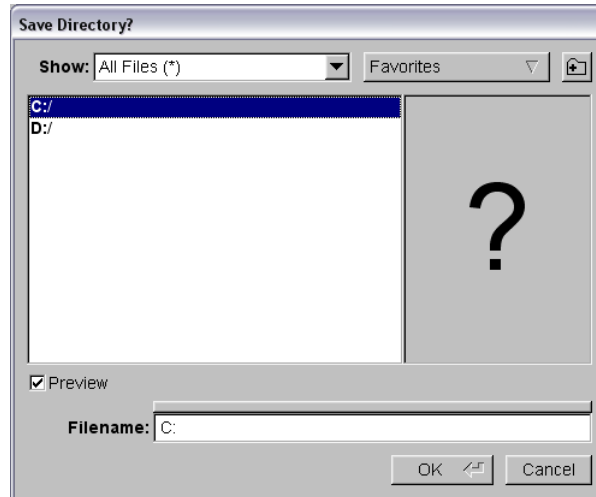
